**ENROLMENT** Postal is best. We have no card facilities. Once you have completed the **enrolment form** on page 5, send it to us with your **cheque made out to QEGS**. You have then guaranteed your place on your chosen course. You just have to come along on the first evening, because we always run the first class. We will bank your cheque on receipt. If your class still has insufficient enrolments 2 days before the second session is due we will phone you, and refund your fee less that one class fee.

Alternatively, you do not have to complete the enrolment form. Simply send a cheque to QEGS with your name, address, telephone number, chosen class and an sae if you wish for a receipt. We do not send out receipts without a sae.

You can also leave enrolling to the first evening of your class.

**FULL CLASS** If your class is full when we receive your cheque and we are unable to run another class on your chosen subject at the same time, we will immediately return your cheque/telephone you, to let you know.

**CONTINUATION CLASSES** You can enrol **just for the continuation class** if this is appropriate for you. We would be glad to advise you if that would help. Please mark your cheque/enrolment form 'continuation'. We must receive your cheque at the latest three days before the continuation class is due to start. Please check if the class has sufficient students to run. It will not automatically be run on the first continuation evening as it is on the first evening.

**ON YOUR FIRST EVENING** Come to the **canopied entrance** to the school down from the main entrance. **DO NOT** enter through the main school reception. Please arrive five to ten minutes before the start of your first class. We will be there with your tutors to greet and direct you. Your tutor will ask you to complete a short registration form prior to the start of your first class. **Free tea, coffee and biscuits will be available most evenings until 8.00 pm. On Wednesday evenings there will also be squash and cookies at 5.00 pm onwards for students attending the Family Learning courses.**

**PARKING** at QEGS is plentiful on those evenings when there are no after school events. If possible we will warn you if parking is going to be difficult.

The Specialist School Trust pays the Coordinator. Teaching fees are paid from student fees. This means there can unfortunately be no reduced fees.

**Interested in teaching?** We always have a need to refresh and extend our programme. If you have teaching/training experience of any kind and a passionate interest in a subject, we want to hear from you. **Interested in a course we don't offer?** Let us know!

**Welcome** to the fourth Autumn Programme at Queen Elizabeth's Grammar School Horncastle (and look out for the Spring 2011 Programme!)

We listen to your comments and try hard to respond to them and as a result we are offering various new classes.

At last we are able to offer a Bridge course for absolute beginners, initially for nine weeks, with the promise of a further nine weeks in the Spring Programme. Tony Barlow, one of the teachers at Lincoln Eastgate Bridge Club, will be your tutor. Another very exciting new course is Film Making. Andrew Neal is offering to provide you with all the necessary skills to start producing your own films. This course will again continue into the Spring Programme, so you can follow a complete course or you can just do one or two of the three modules, as you wish. And if you need to learn about acting and drama, then we have a course on professional acting from a professional actor, David Kerwick, and a course on play staging and interpretation from Jo Woodhouse.

Claire Cook is delighted to offer Level 1 ECDL at a manageable price, with the option of taking further classes for the full qualification, as well as her popular absolute beginners and improvers computing courses. Chris Barratt is offering web site design again as well as a new course in computer programming. Steve Robinson is again offering Photoshop.

We have extended our craft provision to offer a 3-D creative course using fabric. QEGS Head of Textiles recommended this course to us. She found the tutor Nicky Dillerstone to be a talented and inspirational teacher who enabled all her adult students to make unique and beautiful things.

Our language provision is extended to include German and Arabic, taught by two very experienced teachers known to some of you, Ingrid Chambers and Ghada Mohammed. David Rees is now doing all our Spanish teaching. Andrew Gorton is no longer able to teach Spanish for us as he is now working for Lincoln University. Carolyn Goddard who has taught for us so loyally since the programme first started, feels the journey from Lincoln in the evenings a bit more that she can cheerfully contemplate.

There are lots of other new delights awaiting you, like Salsa, Collage, Whole Health and Computer Image Portraiture, and of course many courses that have proved so popular in the past (such as Philosophy and Ethics), are on offer to you again.

Finally, for the first time we are offering three Family Learning courses on a Wednesday evening from 5.15 to 6.45pm. Squash and cookies, as well as the usual tea, coffee and biscuits will be available free of charge to you and your child at the start of each evening. We are hoping to welcome Dads, Grandparents, Carers and other family members, as well as Mums. The charge of £30, quoted in this Prospectus, covers both parent and child (and we are prepared to listen sympathetically to those of you who would like/need to bring two children).

Patchwork, Film making, Italian and Photoshop are already enrolling (and that's before this Prospectus goes public!) so don't hesitate to get your enrolment form complete (Page 5). If you do need to wait until enrolment evening, particularly if you would like to talk to your prospective tutor, then do remember we are often able to offer a parallel class if your class turns out to be full. You can always phone me, Marianne Watkins, if you need further information about your knowledge base or your course content. In certain cases I will be able to refer you to your tutor. Our assurance is that every class will run, at the very least for the first evening, so don't worry that you will be disappointed. We had to turn away only three students in the last programme and they all had one free class! One hundred and thirty students kept coming all through that last horrid winter with only a few dropping out. The hot tea and coffee available in the entrance was particularly welcomed on some nights as you can imagine!

## **MODERN LANGUAGES**

**All courses offer a four week continuation. The price for French and ESOL is £36 and £40 for all other courses.**

### **French for Absolute Beginners 5 weeks 7-8.30 pm Wednesday £45 Room 24**

Yet again we are delighted to offer this popular course taught by Elisabeth (Babette) Willis. This really is a course for absolute beginners. For example Babette will start by counting in French.

So if you have a little knowledge or you have already attended one of the absolute beginners' classes, perhaps you might consider:

### **French Improvers Level 1 Thursday 7-8.30 pm 5 weeks £45 Room 24**

This course is for those with a very little French who now feel confident to ask for a loaf of bread or even directions. They can begin to read some of the headlines in the newspapers and names of shops and streets. This course is not appropriate for those who have been studying French for some time.

### **Italian for Absolute Beginners 5 weeks 7-9 pm Monday £50 Room 23**

This is a repetition of the Absolute Beginners course that Anne-Marie Colautti has taught with such approval during the Autumn Term. She will start you from a base of no knowledge and you will soon find yourself enjoying learning and beginning to speak this musical language.

### **Italian Improvers Level 1 Thursday 5 weeks 7-9 pm £50 Room 23**

This course has been designed to lead on from the Absolute Beginners class. Of course if you have a little Italian you are most welcome to come and join us. Anne-Marie aims for you to be able to communicate in everyday situations when in Italy. You will begin to develop an understanding of Italian culture. The topics to be considered are visiting a town, accommodation, asking for directions and going shopping.

### **Spanish for Absolute Beginners Monday 5 weeks 7-9 pm £50 Room 24**

This course is suitable for those of you who have no or only a very few words of Spanish. You will learn to express yourself in common everyday situations such as finding your way or buying food or drink in a bar. The Spanish are always pleased to hear you speak their language and are sympathetic towards you. David Rees is a very experienced teacher/ speaker of Spanish married to a Spanish lady, so he has to have good communication skills!

### **Spanish Improvers Level 1 Wednesday 5 weeks 7-9 pm £50 Room 23**

If you already have a little Spanish you will be most welcome to join this class led by David Rees. This course is also suitable for all students who have done Beginners Spanish in the past with Andrew Gorton or Carolyn Goddard. Grammar will be taught in order to support speaking rather than an end in itself.

**Modern Languages continued**

**German for Beginners Wednesday 5 weeks 7-9 pm £50 Room 22**

We are delighted to finally be able to offer a course in beginners German. As in most beginner language classes, Ingrid will teach you to cope in very basic everyday situations, building your grammar skills as you go. Ingrid has recently retired from QEGS where she is much respected for her high teaching standards. She has masterminded the growth of German GCSE from one to four teaching groups in the time she has been with us.

**Arabic for Beginners Monday 5 weeks 7-9 pm £50 Room 22**

Ghada has been taking special classes in beginners Arabic at QEGS for the last two years for both children and adults during the day for the languages Department, so it was high time that Adult Education obtained her services. This course is suitable for all those who wish to learn Arabic.

**ESOL for ladies only Monday 5 weeks 5.15 -6.45pm £45 Room 24**

As well as teaching Spanish David Rees has varied experience of teaching English to speakers of other languages. This course has been designed specifically for ladies who would prefer to be in a group of other ladies. We encourage our students to bring a friend or partner or either gender as a companion for at least the first lesson if that would make them feel more comfortable.

**MATHEMATICS**

**Maths GCSE Thursday 30 weeks 9.15 – 11.15 am £230**

This is the sixth year that we are able to offer Maths GCSE for adults. This year we are running the course during the day for those who are unable to attend in the evening. The course will start on Thursday 10 November and continue in the first term until Thursday 16 December. Classes will resume again on Thursday 7 January running through to 7 March 2011 when additional classes will be offered as well on alternate Tuesday and Wednesday evenings. The syllabus is Edexcel Higher GCSE Linear. This has been a very successful course with all students grading at C or above in their examinations. Amazement has been expressed by some students at how much they have enjoyed these classes, the company, the laughs and the sense of achievement at understanding (most of) Maths at last. Virtually all students start the course by privately confiding to the tutor Marianne Watkins how useless they feel they are at Maths!

**AS Maths Monday 6-8pm £250 for 10 weeks Room 7**

This course is especially designed to respond to student needs. For this reason a student is asked only to purchase ten weeks of tuition at a time. You will be entered for Core 1/Higher GCSE in January 2011. If you wish you can proceed onto Core 2 and one other module of your choice so completing your AS in Mathematics. It is essential that you come for a short interview before you are accepted on this course. Please contact the Adult Education Coordinator Marianne Watkins on 01526 352153.

## **ARTS and CRAFTS**

**Most classes will offer a four week continuation**

### **Patchwork and Quilting Thursday 5 weeks 7-9 pm £50 Room 2**

A range of traditional and contemporary techniques will be included in this course taught by Jenny Lucas. Small projects will be worked and larger projects will be available for the more experienced. Jenny is exploring 3-D fabric effects this term. Guidance will be given at each stage to include pattern selection and fabric choices. Students will be encouraged to develop their own 'style'. This course is suitable for beginners or those with some experience. Continuation is £40.

### **Upholstery Wednesday 5 weeks 7-9 pm £60 Room 9**

We are delighted that David Greenfield is able to offer this upholstery course for us. You will be in Room 9 and that means that you can park your car at the back of the school. You will then not have far to carry the small piece of furniture that you wish to recover. Please do not bring anything other than this piece of furniture on your first evening. David will have all the necessary equipment with him and will then advise you as to what you may need to purchase. The aim is to keep the cost of materials to the absolute minimum. When you arrive, park at the back of the school and leave your furniture in your car. This car park is close to your classroom, Room 9. Go to the canopied entrance first and, once you are enrolled we will be able to show you to your classroom. Then you can fetch your furniture from your car via the back exit close to Room 9. The continuation course is £50.

### **Photoshop for Beginners Monday 5 weeks 7-9 pm £50 ELC**

Stephen Robinson, currently teaching at Monk's Dyke Louth, will show you how to crop and colour your photographs and remove any blemishes. You will learn to use selection tools and work in layers in order to combine images. Filters and special effects may be added as well as text. Images will be created and montages of images made by using the Internet. The package is Photoshop. A continuation may be offered for £40

### **Beginners Painting in Watercolour Wednesday 5 weeks 7-9 pm £50 Room 10**

This course is aimed at both beginners and improvers and covers all the basic techniques and principles of watercolour. Included in each session are step-by-step demonstrations, one-to-one attention, tips, advice and help with problem solving. You will easily produce successful artwork. Basic paint, brushes and sturdy/stretched watercolour paper will be required for the first session.

### **Sugarcraft Monday 5 weeks 7-9 pm £50 Room 12**

This was a very popular class when it ran in the Autumn Term. You will need a small rolling pin and rolling board (easily obtained from a child's cookery set), a box to keep the cake you will eventually decorate and a tea towel. This class is suitable for those who attended in the Autumn, absolute beginners and those who have some experience because the class size will be kept small. The tutor is Dinah Ward and a continuation will be offered for £40. The class is held in Room 12 so after the first evening you will be able to use a side door to enter the building rather than walk all the way from the main entrance. But don't forget the tea and coffee available for you in the entrance foyer, and if necessary send a runner with a tray for those who wish for refreshment!

## **Arts and Crafts continued**

**Most classes will offer a four week continuation**

### **Artistic Creations- Collage and Mixed Media for Beginners – your special memories Monday 5 weeks 7-9 pm £50 Room 10**

Explore various collage techniques with your tutor Tina Robson and work towards creating that special piece that encapsulates precious and significant life memories. You will use 2-D, 3-D and high relief techniques to make your life story come alive. Found materials, altered objects and original creations will be combined and transformed into unique pieces of art.

### **Sculptural Textiles and Mixed Media Monday 5 weeks 7-9 pm £50 Room 2**

The mundane title of this course belies the magical and creative world you will enter as you find your fingers creating beautiful tactile 3-D objects using fabric and acrylic paints. You can choose to make a woodland book, a mirror or a box. Your tutor Nicky will open the door to skills that you would have never thought possible before you started this course. This course is about texture and colour and exploring lovely fabrics. Prepare to be astonished at yourself! ## **BRIDGE**

### **Beginners Bridge Monday 9 weeks 7-9 pm £100 Room 5**

We are delighted to have finally obtained the services of Tony Barlow, a teacher of Bridge at Eastgate Bridge Club Lincoln. Tony writes: 'Familiarity with a deck of cards will be an advantage but complete beginners to card games are welcome. Some knowledge of card games, ideally Whist or Solo would be an advantage. Previous knowledge of bidding is not necessary, as the course will cover a basic bidding system with card play.'

## **HUMANITIES**

### **Tennyson and his World Monday 3 weeks 7-9 pm £30 IR Room**

The first evening of this course is given by the locally well known Lincolnshire Expert Loretta Rivetts, who will delight and entertain you with her knowledge of the customs and dialect of the 19<sup>th</sup> Century Lincolnshire Wolds where the young Tennyson was born and matured. The second two evenings are given by our historian Steve Harrington who will tell you of the world that Tennyson found on leaving the rectory of Somersby. This course has been inspired and informed by the two QEGS Tennyson days that took place on Friday 9 and Monday 12 July.

### **Victorian Social History Wednesday 5 weeks 7-9 pm £50 IR Room**

This is a new course on Victorian social history from Steve Harrington. He is looking at the Victorian class system, the repercussions of which are still with us. Poverty, Workhouses and the role of Women will all be examined.

## Humanities continued

### **Philosophy and Ethics Wednesday 5 weeks 7-8.30pm £45 Room 2**

The fame of Bob Edwards continues to spread! If you missed the first part of his course on Philosophy and Ethics, now is your opportunity to discover why previous students have been so delighted with this course. Bob will offer the continuation in the Spring Programme and he talks of a widening content to that offered in the continuation of last Autumn's Programme.

## **COMPUTER STUDIES**

### **ECDL essentials Level 1 Monday 9 weeks 7-9 pm £105 (in addition there will be a charge for BCS\* registration of £30) Room 25**

A basic knowledge of IT/computing is needed to study ECDL. It is designed for people wishing to gain a benchmark qualification in computing to enhance their career prospects or for personal development. The skills gained over the course of the qualification will not only improve your career options, but take the frustration out of using your computer on an everyday basis by boosting both your efficiency and your confidence.

The basic ECDL qualification is broken down into two levels: ECDL Essentials (the course we are currently offering) and ECDL extra. ECDL Essentials is a level 1 ITQ Award and comprises three modules. ECDL Extra is a Level2 ITQ Certificate and comprises four modules. **WE PLAN TO OFFER ECDL EXTRA IN THE AUTUMN PROGRAMME.**

### **Absolute Beginners Computing Wednesday 5 weeks 7-9 pm £50 Room 26**

Claire Cook is again offering her popular course for computing for absolute beginners, a course particularly attractive for the older person. She will take you from the first step of switching the computer on and logging on to working with email and accessing the Internet.

### **Computing for Improvers Wednesday 4 weeks 7-9 pm £40 Starting Wednesday 10 November Room 26**

This course is for graduates from the first course for absolute beginners and for those who know a little but want to know more. Claire will be showing you basic spreadsheets and how to make a PowerPoint presentation.

### **Computer Programming for Beginners Wednesday 6 weeks 7-9 pm £70 Starting Wednesday 3 November Room 25**

This course requires students to be daily computer users more than comfortable with Word, emailing and the net. This is the first part of a course that will continue into the Autumn Programme. Your tutor is Chris Barratt who has taught successfully for us for the last two years.

## **Computer Studies continued**

### **Web Site Design Thursday 9 weeks 7-9 pm £95 Room 25**

Chris Barratt is again offering this course for those who want to set up their own website. You must have some knowledge and confidence with computing. A Level 1 qualification in computing would be a good starting point for you. If you have not got that formal qualification in computing then you must be able to email, use Word and confidently follow the format in which software instructions are given. This course was successfully run in last autumn's programme and no student failed to complete the course.

### **Photoshop Monday 5 weeks 7-9 pm £50 ELC**

## **WELL BEING**

### **Salsa Monday 9 weeks 7-9 pm £55 Hall/Sixth Form Centre**

We are delighted to offer this extension to our dance classes. Debbie Mitchell will teach you a mixture of Latin American and Salsa. Fabulous fun and fabulous exercise!

### **Whole Health Monday 5 weeks 7-9 pm £50 Room 9**

Have you any persistent health problems for which the medical profession have done their best but the problem is still not fully alleviated? Do you doubt advertised 'quick' (quack) fixes or mystic magic solutions? Do you want to go into older age positively and productively? This course is about taking charge of your own health by learning about your body and using your common sense and life knowledge to refuse to accept that good enough is enough. Carol Allison-Maybank will lead you through these evenings to move you into a positive, in charge-of-your-health place by increasing your understanding of your body and showing you what you can do to improve your situation.

### **Ballroom Dancing Wednesday 9 weeks 7-9 pm £55 Hall/Sixth Form Centre**

Joan Matson is once again offering this popular course in ballroom dancing for absolute beginners and improvers. The course will start at the beginning with basic steps and simple variations in the following dances: waltz, quickstep, slow foxtrot, social foxtrot, cha cha cha, jive and rumba. Wear anything you feel comfortable in. No trainers, stiletto heels or steel tipped shoes should be worn and you are advised to bring a soft drink. Joan welcomes single dancers and will always dance with the singleton providing they appreciate that it cannot be all the lesson time as she must stop and teach sometimes. We would be pleased to offer a further term of tuition if sufficient students were interested.

### **First Aid 3 weeks Thursday 7-8.30 pm £30 Room 8**

This is an opportunity to learn how to help in an emergency. Julian Graves of Lives will come and talk to you about emergencies with children, dealing with the symptoms of chronic illnesses such as epilepsy and CPR, cardio pulmonary resuscitation. This is a practical as well as theoretical course so you will be practicing the necessary procedures. You may request a letter of attendance. You may then be the named first aid person in an organisation.

## **PROFESSIONAL STUDIES**

### **Accountancy Thursday 9 weeks 7-9 pm £100 Room 6**

This course is for those who need to do basic accounting for a small business or for charity work. You will need to be able to work at least at Numeracy Level 1. (Please contact the Adult Education Coordinator if you need advice on what that means.) Sales and Purchase Ledgers, Business Plans, VAT and Profit and Loss Accounts are some of the topics that will be studied. Steve Harrington is a professional accountant who achieved his qualifications from part-time study, so he is very aware of the pressures on those studying in their own time. He will also explore the use of basic accountancy software.

### **Communicate! Thursday 9 weeks 7-9 pm £100 Room 5**

Are you skilled at your job but feel you need to 'brush up' your written and presentation skills to be really appreciated and achieve your potential? Probably you already have a GCSE in English at least at Grade C, but it is so long since you had to write reports or formal letters, that you have lost confidence in your ability to write correctly. You know what you want to say when it comes to a meeting or fronting a presentation but you know that you need some professional guidance to put over yourself and your ideas. Jo Woodhouse has had many years working with and helping students hone writing and presentation skills and she will be able to help you.

**This course is also recommended for mature students returning to Higher or Further Education.**

## **PERFORMING ARTS**

### **Play to Stage Monday 5 weeks 7-9 pm £50 Room 6**

Jo Woodhouse will demonstrate using part of a play of Shakespeare how text can be transformed and clarified by staging rather than just reading. This will prove a useful and enjoyable activity for students of English, Drama and Film making, as well as of great general interest.

### **Acoustic Guitar Monday 5 weeks 7-9 pm £50 Room 3**

This is a course for absolute beginners. Allan Johnson will be your tutor. There is little musical theory or notation. The emphasis is on chord building and the aim is to achieve the playing of a simple melody by lesson 2/lesson 3 since by then the student should be proficient in the production of two basic chords. Many songs are based on just two chords. Various popular music styles from the 60's are explored and indeed even those lovely melodies of the thirties and forties may be visited depending on the students' musical inclinations. Book 1 of the 'Complete Guitar Player' by Russ Shipton will give you a good idea of the lessons content, but is not a necessary purchase. The group will be kept at six students to facilitate learning. A continuation of four weeks at £40 will be offered.

### **Professional Acting Wednesday 5 weeks 7-9 pm £50 Hall**

David Kerwick is an actor and an acting agent who has previously taught at Stamford College. He describes this course as a bridge between amateur performance and Drama College. But this is not just for those who are already acting. If you have always wanted to act but have not yet had that opportunity then you too will find this course is for you. To act requires an examination of self that is as relevant and challenging to the confident performer as to the unconfident performer. You will have to answer questions such as 'Who am I? 'What do I think and why do I think it?' and 'What do I desire?' A first continuation of four weeks will be offered for £40. The course will hopefully continue into the Spring Programme.

**Making a Short Film Thursday 7-9 pm £65 Room 17**
